## **A MESSAGE FROM RABBI IRA ROTHSTEIN**

### **LIGHTS AND PATHS**

As this New Year begins, it is logical to ask ourselves what we will find on our path. We all travel our own path, but nothing should ever stop us from joining others along the way. We may all have our individual destinies to fulfill, but that does not mean we cannot learn and grow from each other along the way. One of the primary benefits of being part of a synagogue is to have a place to learn, pray, celebrate, mourn and hopefully grow. It is in the “sharing of our path” that we are best able to grow as people and as Jews. Consider this story as an illustration of the power of a shared path.

Once upon a time there was a nobleman who decided to build a brand new synagogue for his small village. On the day of the grand opening, the people breathlessly walked through their new synagogue. They had never seen a sanctuary so stunning. They had never walked the halls of a building so inspiring. Yet there was something missing. One of the townspeople asked the nobleman, “Sir, this synagogue is truly stunning, but where are the lamps? There is not one candle or lamp on the walls. How are we to see?” “Look at the walls, said the nobleman,” and you will see empty brackets.” The nobleman then gave each person a lamp and said, “Whenever you come to synagogue bring your lamp and place it in the empty brackets. And that

way, whenever we are all together, our synagogue will be illuminated. But, when you are not here, the lamp is in your house that belongs in the synagogue and it will remind you that some part of your synagogue is dark. I have built the shell, but you must bring the light. Share your light with each other and you will be a community.”

This coming year, I invite you to share your light with us at services, classes and programs. In the mutual sharing of our light, we can illuminate our path in a world that is all too often filled with darkness.

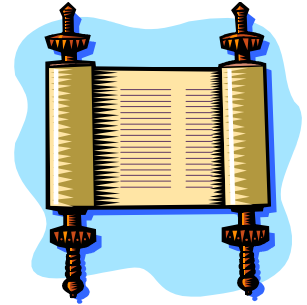

## **HIGH HOLIDAY HIGHLIGHTS**

The High Holidays are a time of spirituality. Please note the following highlights which are designed to heighten the quality of our High Holiday experience.

1. **THIS YEAR YOU WILL ONCE AGAIN HEAR AND SEE SOMETHING DIFFERENT**

High Holiday services each year are very enjoyable. Our reformatted prayer books make our service “user friendly”. Our TBS prayer books incorporate transliterations, instructions, explanations and selected meditations. This is what will happen once again this year at our High Holiday services:

- ☆ The level of communal singing and participation will continue to dramatically increase.
- ☆ We will continue to rededicate ourselves to the centrality of family prayer. With the exception of one forty-five minute period (around sermon time), children will be spending services in the main Sanctuary or Auditorium with their families.
- ☆ We hope people will choose to stay for the entire service.
- ☆ 300 worshipers will attend our Family Worship Service in the TBS activity Center for the morning services on the first and second day of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning.

### **PLEASE NOTE PRAYER TIME SCHEDULES**

**ROSH HASHANAH.....9:30AM - 12:30PM**

**YOM KIPPUR.....9:30AM - 1PM**

**Sermon times are approximately 11AM (FOR MAIN SERVICES ONLY)  
FAMILY WORSHIP SERVICES.....10AM TO 11:30AM**

Times are approximate, but we do hope that our reformatted service will increase participation and encourage you to make a commitment to the entire service. Most importantly, our goal is to infuse as much meaning as possible into our services. We believe that we are on the correct path! Try it- you'll like it!

2. **TASHLICH- THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 9TH AT 6PM**

Every year more and more people participate in our Tashlich service. We meet at 6PM in the Synagogue parking lot, walk with a police escort down Taylors Mills Road to a small body of water. We will gather at the corner of Elliot Road and Taylors Mills Road to recite the Tashlich ceremony and hear the blowing of the shofar. We will then proceed to the brook to symbolically cast away our sins by tossing small pieces of bread into the water, If you have any sins, bring bread- plenty of bread! It's a stirring ceremony. Please join us. After Tashlich, we will return to the TBS Sanctuary for the afternoon service.

3. **CHILDREN'S SERVICES**

Our commitment to family worship means that children will worship with their families in the Sanctuary and Manalapan High School Auditorium.

However, there will be a forty minute service for children around sermon time. This will enable children to have their own special prayer experiences. Children's worship will take place between 11:15AM and 12Noon, **but these times are approximate. An announcement will be made from the Bimah.**

Children will be dismissed from the regular service and escorted to the children's worship areas. They will then be escorted back to the Sanctuary/Auditorium at the conclusion of the children's worship service.

THE CHILDREN'S SERVICES ARE ONLY FOR THOSE CHILDREN ATTENDING THE MAIN SANCTUARY AND AUDITORIUM SERVICE WITH THEIR PARENTS.

THE FAMILY WORSHIP SERVICE WILL BE IT'S OWN SELF CONTAINED SERVICE LOCATED IN THE TBS ACTIVITY CENTER.

#### 4. **CHILDREN'S WORSHIP SERVICE LOCATIONS**

\*All children under age 7 are asked to be taken to babysitting during the Rabbi's sermon.

\*All Dalet and Hey students are expected to remain in the Sanctuary for all services.

**REMINDER: PLEASE DO NOT TAKE YOUR CHILD DIRECTLY TO THESE AREAS. AN ANNOUNCEMENT WILL BE MADE FROM THE BIMAH AND THE CHILDREN WILL BE TAKEN TO AND FROM THE MAIN SANCTUARY/AUDITORIUM SERVICES BY OUR EDUCATION USHERS.**

#### 5. **FAMILY WORSHIP SERVICES- IN TBS ACTIVITY CENTER FROM 10AM TO 11:30AM. (ROSH HASHANAH DAY 1, DAY 2 AND YOM KIPPUR MORNINGS)**

Entrance to these services will only be granted to those who pre-signed up for this service and have the appropriate picture ID ticket.

This service will follow the same structure as our Shabbat morning Family Worship Services and will be led by Nancy Shechter, our Education Director. High Holiday Family Worship Services will emphasize congregational singing, joint family participation and a give and take process of learning.

**If you have not yet signed up for this service and are interested in attending any or all of the three services, please contact the Temple office to see if there is still any seating available.**

6. **ROSH HASHANAH SHOFAR BLOWING**: Shofar blowing is a highlight of every Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur Service. It is a sound which urges us to recognize our faults and awaken to our full potential. Please remember that the first shofar blowing takes place after the Haftarah and preceding the sermon. Rosh Hashanah Shofar blowing will take place at all service locations.

7. **KOL NIDRE FOOD DRIVE:** On Kol Nidre, we will breathe life into the words of the Prophet Isaiah. “Share your bread with the hungry, do not turn away people in need.” When you arrive for Kol Nidre, please bring cans of kosher food with you. The food bin will be located in the lobby of our synagogue and in the lobby of the MHS Auditorium. The food will be transported after the holidays to the Open Door Food Pantry in Freehold and the Samaritan Center Food Pantry in Englishtown. Yes, food can make a difference in a person’s life. Please help. It’s a mitzvah and it is the right way to initiate the holiest day of the year.
  
8. **YOM KIPPUR COMMUNAL MISHEBERACH- A PRAYER FOR WELL BEING**  
There is wonderful spiritual energy waiting to be tapped in any large group of worshipers. The communal misheberach is our opportunity to express our hopes and prayers for well being. The misheberach’s power is that we pray not only for our own loved ones, but for each other’s loved ones. It’s a powerful experience and it will take place at the conclusion of the Yom Kippur Torah Reading portion of services.
  
9. **HAVDALAH- SHOFAR BLOWING-** We have had a wonderful custom in our congregation. Many people return at the end of Yom Kippur to see Havdalah and listen to the sound of the shofar. All 8 to 10 year olds will be invited to participate in our Havdalah candle procession and service. We are also once again inviting congregants, children and adults to blow shofar. We hope to fill the Sanctuary with the sound of shofrot. If you’d like to blow shofar, please sign up. We believe it will be an experience that you will not soon forget. Please remember that shofar blowing will take place at approximately 7:45PM. The Havdalah ceremony will precede the shofar blowing.

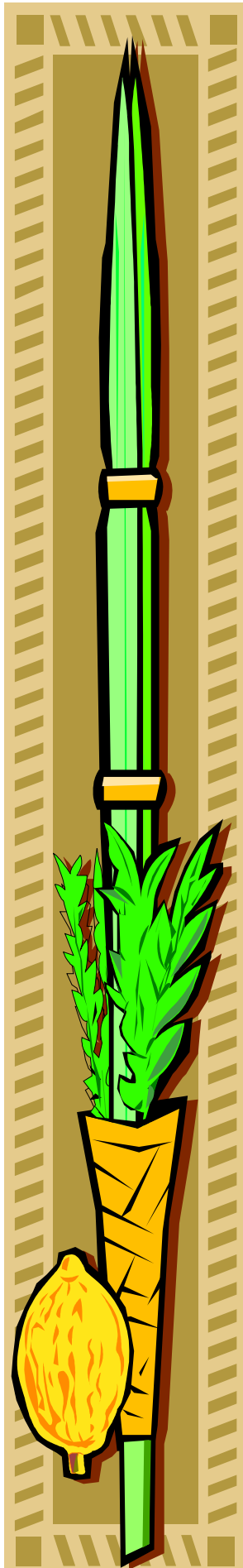

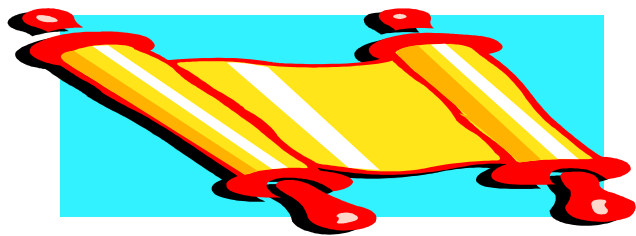
